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Glen Moray 14 Years (2007/2021) - Malts of Scotland

There are whiskies that invite reflection, others that astonish. And then there are those that smile at you sweetly – only to throw a ginger bomb onto your palate a second later. The Glen Moray 2007/2021, bottled by Malts of Scotland, belongs to this third category – a surprising and exciting release from the Glen Moray distillery, located in the Speyside region near the Highlands. Aged for 14 years in a bourbon cask, bottled at a bold 56.3% ABV, non-chill filtered, natural colour – just the way we purists like it.

TASTING NOTES

NOSE

Once poured, the aromatic performance begins. The first impressions? Peach and apricot – nonstop. Ripe, almost tropically lush fruits, wrapped in a sweetness reminiscent of gummy bears – think Haribo Tropifrutti. Below that lies crumbly iced tea, somewhere between peach and black tea, with a touch of honey, very clear and floral. Then comes a wave of vanilla pudding topped with whipped cream. This is a bourbon cask bouquet overload that's not simply typical – it's compelling and multilayered. Even those who think they've tasted enough bourbon-matured whiskies might find themselves surprised.

PALATE

The initial mouthfeel is slightly effervescent, perhaps due to the high ABV, yet never harsh – more like a ginger shot served with a wink. Then, a creamy texture unfolds, echoing that earlier vanilla pudding. Layers of lemon zest, lychee, and dragon fruit add freshness and finesse. The contrast is what makes this dram exciting: it begins like a comforting dessert, only to suddenly deliver a spicy punch with ginger and citrus. It's different. And that's what makes it memorable.

FINISH

The finish is not overly long, but it's pleasant and leaves a clear impression. Honeyed sweetness remains on the tongue, with ginger making one final statement. What's particularly striking: there's surprisingly little oak. For a 14-years matured in a bourbon barrel, that's rare – and a testament to the elegant cask management. No wood overload, no bitterness – just a clean and graceful finale.

THOUGHTS

MARCEL

This Glen Moray 2007/2021 is like a good joke: it entices you with sweet fruitiness, only to surprise you with a ginger bomb – a true delight for anyone who sees whisky as an experience and enjoys the unexpected.

SASCHA

The balance between tropical fruity sweetness and the spicy ginger note makes this Glen Moray 2007/2021 a structured yet unconventional bottling, distinguished by its subtle wood influence and precise cask maturation.
