Haran 12 Years Sherry Cask Finish

The Haran 12 Years Sherry Cask Finish raises the exciting question: Spanish single malt - what is it? With this question in mind, we can look forward to the flavour experiences of this whisky. The combination of Spanish origin and sherry cask finish promises an interesting and possibly surprising tasting experience.

TASTING NOTES

NOSE

At first sniff, the Haran 12 Years reveals a primarily earthy note that spreads pleasantly throughout the glass. This profile is complemented by a light caramel note that adds a subtle sweetness. A hint of hay and grapefruit peel is added, giving the flavour a fresh, citrusy note. The light cobbled note adds an unconventional but interesting dimension, while a delicate malt tone provides a pleasant depth.

PALATE

On the palate, the Spaniard presents itself with an acidic note accompanied by a clear peat character. Citrus fruits and cereals provide a fresh yet warming flavour experience. The creamy texture harmoniously complements the flavours, while herbs and a slight saltiness provide additional complexity.

FINISH

The finish is of medium length and is characterised by aromas of yellow peach and light oak tones. A gentle nuttiness rounds off the finish and leaves a pleasant, slightly sweet aftertaste.

THOUGHTS

MARCEL

The Haran 12 Years Sherry Cask Finish proves that Spanish single malt can indeed have character – it's lively, with an intriguing acidity and a pleasant creaminess. A whisky that's fun to drink and piques curiosity with its blend of earthy and fruity notes. Not mainstream, but precisely for that reason, a rewarding moment of enjoyment.

SASCHA

With well-balanced aromas of peat, citrus, and sherry influence, the Haran 12 Years impresses through its complex structure and medium-length, nuanced finish. The unusual acidity is somewhat dominant but integrates well into the harmonious overall profile. A technically solid example of Spanish single malt with potential, though it could still benefit from a bit of refinement.
