## Miltonduff (2009/2011) - Signatory Vintage

The Miltonduff Signatory Vintage 2009/2021 is a representative from the Speyside region in Scotland. Bottled by the independent bottler Signatory Vintage, this whisky matured for 11 years and has an alcohol content of 46% ABV. The Speyside region is known for its accessible and often fruity whiskies, which makes this drop particularly interesting for beginners. But can this whisky really convince?

### TASTING NOTES

#### NOSE

From the very first nosing, you are greeted by a fresh and light aroma. Notes of green apple and mint dominate, accompanied by a gentle vanilla and a hint of maltiness. The subtle spiciness of curry is particularly exciting and provides an unexpected depth. Overall, the nose is reminiscent of a fresh spring day with the scent of hay and grass in the air.

#### PALATE

The first sip continues the impression of the nose, but with a surprising twist. The flavour is very light, almost watery. The green fruits are present, but there is a slight bitterness. Interestingly, there is a note reminiscent of a wet concrete wall. A hint of chalk and cobbles provides a slightly mineral component. Overall, the flavour is rather restrained and not very exciting.

#### FINISH

The finish is short and spicy, with a slight peppery tingle on the tongue. The whisky does not linger here for long.

### THOUGHTS

#### MARCEL

Fresh and light like a springtime stroll, this Miltonduff offers some casual enjoyment—even if it doesn't exactly set the taste buds dancing. For fans of straightforward Speyside whiskies who aren't looking for big surprises, it's a pleasant companion, but nothing more.

#### SASCHA

The Miltonduff 2009/2021 presents an intriguing combination of fruity and spicy aromas, yet the palate remains thin and lacking in complexity. While there is a balance between freshness and minerality, the fleeting presence and slight bitterness prevent it from leaving a lasting impression.
