Royal Brackla 10 Years (2014/2024) - James Eadie

If whisky bottles could talk, the Royal Brackla 10 years from James Eadie would probably whisper in a charming Highland accent: 'Try me, you won't regret it!'

TASTING NOTES

NOSE

A fruity whirlwind hits you from the very first sniff. Red, ripe apples push their way to the front as if they were about to climb out. They are accompanied by juicy red grapes and a hint of redcurrants - a fruit basket par excellence! But that's not all: a pleasant maltiness and a hint of effervescence ensure that the nose not only sniffs, but dances. Bright fruits and a hint of citrus round off the experience.

PALATE

One sip and you're at the Christmas market - but not at just any stall, but at the crêpes! The sweetness of cinnamon and sugar harmonises with a creamy apple sauce aroma, as if the best autumn flavours had been captured in a bottle. The whisky feels oily and full-bodied, nestling comfortably on the palate, wonderfully carried by the 46% ABV.

FINISH

After the last sip, the Royal Brackla remains present for a long time. A slight ginger kick provides a welcome spiciness, which is complemented by subtle oak notes and a hint of dryness. A fine nuttiness floats along.

THOUGHTS

MARCEL

This Royal Brackla 10 Year from James Eadie is like a warm hug on a cool autumn evening – sweet, spicy, and full of character. The fruity aromas and inviting spice make it the perfect companion for social gatherings or a cozy get-together. Absolutely enjoyable without being overly complicated.

SASCHA

The Royal Brackla 10 Year presents a balanced structure of fruity notes and subtle sherry influences, supported by solid maltiness and fine spice on the finish. The harmony between sweetness, spices, and a light oak texture works well, although the finish could benefit from a bit more depth. A reliable Highlander that impresses with its complexity without feeling overloaded.
